In order to achieve excellence in the current design marketplace, there is a need to understand the tools and processes that make a new media project succeed.

The New Media Program responds to the need for part-time professional upgrading in the rapidly changing and emerging new media industry. The program explores the changes the digital world has brought to human visual communication, production, business, education and information exchange.

The focus of this program is on visual design for new media. The program features certificate and diploma programs offered through classroom-based courses as well as computer lab-based activities. These classes may run during the day, evening, and/or on weekends, and include workshops and seminars. Working in partnership with all areas of the Faculty of Extension and other departments and agencies both inside and outside of the University, the New Media Program provides theoretical concepts and practical hands-on skills for this dynamic profession.

212.7 Legal Studies

The Legal Studies Program (LSP) has a tradition of using a variety of knowledge development and learning methodologies to engage learners in non-degree legal and justice education opportunities. Major components of the program include the following:

LawNow PLUS: a suite of print and electronic resources that includes a bi-monthly publication on contemporary legal issues in Canada, written in everyday language, and *LawNow On-line*, an electronic version of *LawNow* magazine, an electronic archive of past articles and columns, and an e-mailed update of recent provincial and federal cases and legislation.

ACJNet (Access to Justice Network): the national, bilingual Internet portal for accessing law and justice resources in Canada.

Canadian Legal FAQs: a free service provided on the Internet that answers Frequently Asked Questions about the law in Canada.

VIOLET: a learning website on the law and legal process relevant to women in abusive relationships.

RoseNet: a learning website on the law and legal process relevant to immigrant women in abusive relationships.

Consulting Services: The LSP features a multidisciplinary team of professionals who work to provide legal information and education to businesses and community related organizations.

212.8 Master of Arts in Communications and Technology (MACT)

The multidisciplinary Master of Arts in Communications and Technology (MACT) is intended to address a need among workers in a variety of positions

and fields for systematic study of communications in their workplaces. Many of the issues in this area of study are related to the impact of modern communications technologies on the workplace.

The intended audience is knowledge workers who fill responsible positions in various fields including communications, promotions and marketing, information resources, human resources, international initiatives, art and design, fund development, writing and editing, and other knowledge sector fields.

What these knowledge workers have in common is that they operate in environments in which productivity depends on effective communication, and in which much of this communication is mediated by advanced technologies. The main mode of instruction in the MACT program is collaborative, asynchronous distance delivery. That is, the program uses technologies that permit its being accessed from the students' homes or workplaces at times of their own choosing, but also allow group work and other collaborative learning. The program also involves a significant component of face-to-face instruction and interaction during an annual three-week Spring Institute at the University of Alberta campus.

Courses are scheduled so as to permit completion of the entire program in a minimum of two years of part-time study. Prerequisites for entry into the program include a four-year degree from a recognized university, with a GPA of 6.5 (or equivalent) and at least three years of relevant experience in the work force.

212.9.1 Adult Education

The Faculty of Extension provides continuing professional education for educators of adults from a wide range of public and private agencies, including business and industry, government departments, social service agencies, hospitals, community organizations, and educational institutions. 212.9.6 Information Technology

The Information Technology unit in Professional Programs offers programs that are designed to populate Internet development teams for the Edmonton region and beyond. The purpose of each program is to foster mastery of one dimension of the World Wide Web development process.

The **WebBuilder Diploma** program focuses on configuring and operating an Internet presence, on network architecture and Internet protocols, server installation and configuration, and creating dynamic web pages. The program also addresses security issues in the day-to-day operation of a web presence, for instance, the implications for use of clear text versus encrypted data streams.

The **Database Administrator Diploma** program focuses on integrating database functionality with the web presence by learning how to create databases and data warehouses, and by managing Oracle database files and users, privileges and resources.

The **New Media Diploma in Visual Design** program focuses on how the web presents to the viewer visually, its aesthetic appeal and proportionality, as well as navigation and interface design issues and techniques. Learners master still graphics, time-based graphics, 2-D image manipulation, digital audio and video, and the configuration and blending of all of the above.

We are exploring program developments in the following clusters of new and evolving occupations: Internet Programmer, Wireless Developer, Internet Security, and IT Project Management.

Our **short courses** offer more intense and condensed learning experiences in a more focused topic area than those available in our larger, certificate and diploma programs.
